Here is how Christine describes the workshop: "It was love at first sight—on Pinterest, no less—when I first saw this graphic block, often with the name of Japanese X and Plus block. What an opportunity for creative work with color! Each block is its own cohesive "color story" and could easily stand alone. Put nine different-colored blocks together, and the bold (almost chaotic) pattern comes alive. The



workshop begins with the concepts essential to making each block read-color, pattern, and value. I do a demo on cutting and piecing the block, which is a cinch even for beginners. It's fast, and it's fun!"




Member Interview

Meet GINGER RAMIREZ | Ginger, a resident of Marina, works in Salinas, attends classes part-time, and is

raising two teen sons with husband Charlie. "I have a very, very full plate. I love the guild, but I don't normally get to the meetings. This year I'm trying to be more balanced and make time to do the fun stuff." We endorse Ginger's intentions, and look forward to seeing her at guild events!

How did you start quilting? My family is very creative. Charlie's into drawing and comics, and he plays guitar. My sons draw, and my oldest is into photography and film. I never felt like I had a talent, a creative thing. So when I found quilting I thought, 'oh, this is it.' And I felt good at it. I was happy about the things I made. It was a cool, 'me' kind of thing.

I actually learned a lot from Instagram: that's how I started to get into quilting. The first thing I saw that I really wanted to do was the Millefiore / Passacaglia quilt. It's a million cogs of color, and everybody makes it differently. I want to put it here on this wall [she gestures to a spot she's saving above the couch]. I bought the pattern and templates,



What's your quilting style? I definitely like bright, cheery colors. I like the more modern, whimsical, funky stuff. I love when it looks professional, but still homey. Kathrin Brown, who's in the guild—I follow her [on Instagram] and love her stuff. Then there's a designer, Elizabeth Hartman, oh I love her patterns. I've done the whales, and the foxes. I started the hedgehogs but my gosh it's a lot of piecing. So instead of a quilt, I ended up with a bunch of pillows! I like modern, but I really like traditional stuff in modern colors.

Where do you quilt? This is my little corner (a large alcove off the living room, where one surface holds Ginger's sewing gear and another Charlie's computer and drawing materials). What I like best is that it's open, and it's in the heart of the house. And from the position of the sewing table, I can watch TV. [When I'm alone] I my guilty pleasure.

Block of the Month: June 2019 * What Color is Your Suitcase?*



Do you have any travel plans for this summer? Well, before you start the trip, make a block of the month for June. Use fabrics that coordinate and perhaps travel-related fabrics for the suitcase body.

Materials Needed

Suitcase: (1) 4" x 6.5"; (2) 2.5" x 6.5"

Handles/Straps: (2) 1.5" x 6.5"; (1) 1" x 2.5"; (2) 1" x 2"

Background: (4) 1" squares; (1) 1.5" x 2.5"; (2) 2" x 3.75"; (2) 1.75" x

8"; (1) 3" x 12.5"; (1) 2.5" x 12.5"

Note: All seams are 1/4" unless noted otherwise. The outside borders are oversized.

Instructions

- 1. Layout all pieces as they will be sewn together see picture on the right.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (4) 1" background squares. Position a marked square in the outside corners of each of the 2.5" x 6.5" suitcase pieces to do some "Sew-and-flip" corners. Sew on the drawn line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4" and press open.
- 3. Sew together these pieces to a 1.5" x 6.5" strap piece; then add the 4" suitcase piece in the middle. Press seams open.
- 4. Create handle Sew 1" x 2.5" handle to 1.5" x 2.5" background. Press seam open. Add 1"x2" handle fabric on each side. Press. Add background 2" x 3.75" pieces to both sides. Press.
- 5. Sew handle unit to suitcase unit. Press Seam open.
- 6. Add 2" x 8" background to right and left sides.
- 7. Add 2.5" x 12.75" strip to the top. Add 3" x 12.75" strip to bottom. Press seams open.
- 8. Since the outside borders are oversized. Trim the block to 12.5" x 12.5" square.

2.5" x 12.75" 1"x1 2" x3.75 2 X 8" 3" x 12.75"
